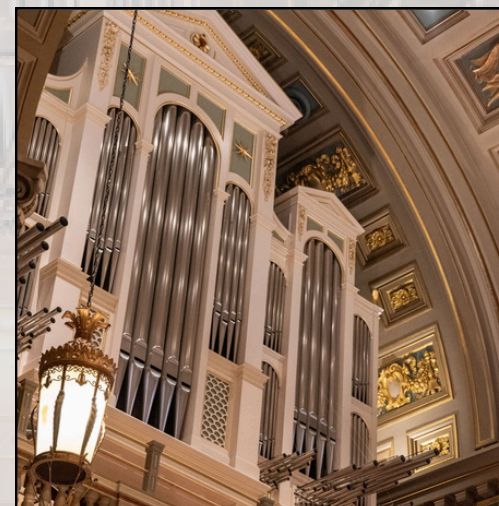
Come, see, and hear:
